An idea driven artist, my current concepts are an extension of my most recent body of work in which I used two interrelated sets of imagery, houses and insects, to resemble daydreams and invoke a sense of wonder. My work explores “the other” within our subconscious as well as through careful observation of the insect and animal worlds as connected to a human environment. In past work, I raised silkworms and moths for most of 3 years. I documented their lives and deaths and layered their imagery into human spaces, both miniature and human scale. I have asked the insects to operate as biological metaphor - addressing states of psychological relationships, exploring themes of addiction, dependency and cycles of death and rebirth. The objects speak to home, both as a place for shelter and sometimes a self-imposed prison. The resulting work has ranged from various print media, assemblage, installation and video work.

My newest ideas continue to intersect animals with human environments. I am combining images of shelter animals with sacred hearts to consider the physical, emotional and psychological histories of animals that have been surrendered to shelters where they are tended to and adopted to new homes. I have just begun the series of small scale mixed media watercolor paintings.
